



Description of the Student Population in Columbia Central University

The student population composition in CCU is heterogeneous. Its two main constituents are traditional students and non-traditional students. As of fall 2022, the institution has 2,320 enrolled in different programs of its four campuses, distributed as follows:



CCU has a diverse student population. The following is a description of the student body at each of CCU's campuses.

a. Caguas Campus Student Profile

a. Caguas Main Campus has 56% (1,310) of the total enrollment. Undergraduate enrollments represent 82%, and graduates represent 18%. 100% of the active campus students are of Hispanic ethnicity. The students come from various socioeconomic backgrounds, 73% of them have financial needs, of these, 78% are in extreme financial need. The undergraduate population is predominantly between the ages of 18 to 21 (42%) and 22 – 32 (32%). Their programs of choice are in the School of Health Sciences (69%), followed by Applied Arts (12%), Technology (6%), and School of Administration (12%). Most are transfer students

(59%), followed by high school graduates (41%). This level is characterized by having more females (69%). The graduate program has students enrolled in the evening and distance education sessions. The students are characterized by females (69%), and 17% are males. The graduate student body population is predominantly between the ages of 22 to 43 (69%). Their program of choice is in the School of Health Sciences (92%), followed by the School of Administration (8%).

b. Yauco Campus Student Profile

a. Yauco has 10% (238) of the total enrollment. The active campus students are 100% of Hispanic ethnicity. These students come from various socioeconomic backgrounds, 81% of them are in financial need, and 70% of these students are in extreme financial need assistance. This population is predominantly between the ages of 16 to 21 (65%). Their program of choice is in the School of Health Sciences (79%), followed by Technology (24%) and Applied Arts (11%). Most are high school graduates (60%), followed by transfer students (40%). The student population is characterized by having more females (74%).

c. Carolina Campus Student Profile

a. Carolina has 17% (381) of the total enrollment. The active campus students are from a diverse ethnicity group; the Campus has 100% Hispanic students all of them are US Citizens. These students come from various socioeconomic backgrounds, 87% of them are in financial need, and 92% of these students are in extreme financial need. The student body population is predominantly between the ages of 16 to 21 (48%). Furthermore, they are enrolled in academic programs from the School of Health Sciences. Most are transfer students (51%), followed by high school graduates (49%). Also, this Campus is characterized by having more females (81%).

d. Bayamón Campus Student Profile

a. Bayamón has 17% (391) of the total enrollment. The active campus students are of Hispanic ethnicity. These students come from various socioeconomic backgrounds, 75% of them are in financial need, and 78% of these students are in extreme financial need. This population is predominantly between the ages of 16 to 21 (52%). Furthermore, they are enrolled in academic programs from the School of Health Sciences. Most of them are transfer students (57%), followed by high school graduates (43%). Also, this Campus is characterized by having more females (83%).
