Notice of Federal Student Financial Aid Penalties for Drug Law Violations

FINANCIAL AID OFFICE

According to the U.S. Department of Education, if a student gets convicted of a drug offense after receiving federal aid money, he or she must immediately notify the Financial Aid Office. That student will become ineligible for future financial aid and must repay any post-conviction aid received.

If a conviction arises, a student may be able to take advantage of rehabilitation programs that may allow him or her to become eligible for federal financial aid again.

Students convicted of possession or sale of drugs

A federal or state drug conviction may disqualify a student from receiving federal financial aid funds. Convictions only count if they were for an offense that occurred during a period of enrollment for which the student was receiving Title IV aid; they do not count if the offense was not during that period. Also, a conviction that was reversed, set aside, or removed from the student's record does not count. Neither a conviction received while a minor, unless prosecuted as an adult.

The following chart illustrates the period of ineligibility for federal financial aid, depending on whether the conviction was for the sale or use of drugs and whether the student had prior offenses. A conviction for the sale of drugs includes convictions for conspiracy to sell drugs.

	Possession of illegal drugs	Sale of illegal drugs
<i>First Offense</i>	One (1) year from date of conviction	Two (2) years from the date of conviction
<i>Second Offense</i>	Two (2) years from date of conviction	Indefinite period
<i>Three or more offenses</i>	Indefinite period	

Suppose the student gets convicted of both possession and sale of illegal drugs, and the periods of ineligibility are different. In that case, the student will be ineligible for a more extended period. A student regains eligibility the day after his or her period of ineligibility ends or when he or she completes a qualified drug rehabilitation program. Future convictions will make him/her ineligible again. It is the student's responsibility to report that he or she has satisfactorily completed the rehabilitation program.

FERPA guarantees students certain rights concerning their education records.

These are:

The right to inspect and review their education records within 45 days of the day the university receives a request to do so. Students must submit a written request to the Registrar's Office indicating the record(s) to be inspected. The university official will make arrangements for the inspection and notify the student when and where the inspection may occur.

The right to request changes to transcripts due to information the student believes is incorrect. The student must submit the request to the university Registrar's Office, identifying the required amendment and specifying the transcript error. If the university decides not to amend the record following the student's request, the university will notify the student of its decision and indicate the student's right to request an appeal hearing. Additional information regarding the procedures concerning the hearing is posted on the web at www.columbiacentral.edu Financial Aid, Student Consumer Information, and in the Student Consumer Handbook.

The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except that FERPA provides for disclosure without consent. One exception that permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to university officials, serving in an administrative, supervisory, academic, or research position, and support staff (including parking lot attendants). Persons or companies with whom the University has contracted (attorneys, auditors, or financial collection agents). Students serving on an official committee (such as a disciplinary committee) or any student serving as an assistant to a university official. It is understood that a university official has a legitimate educational interest if he or she needs to review an educational record as part of his or her professional responsibilities.
